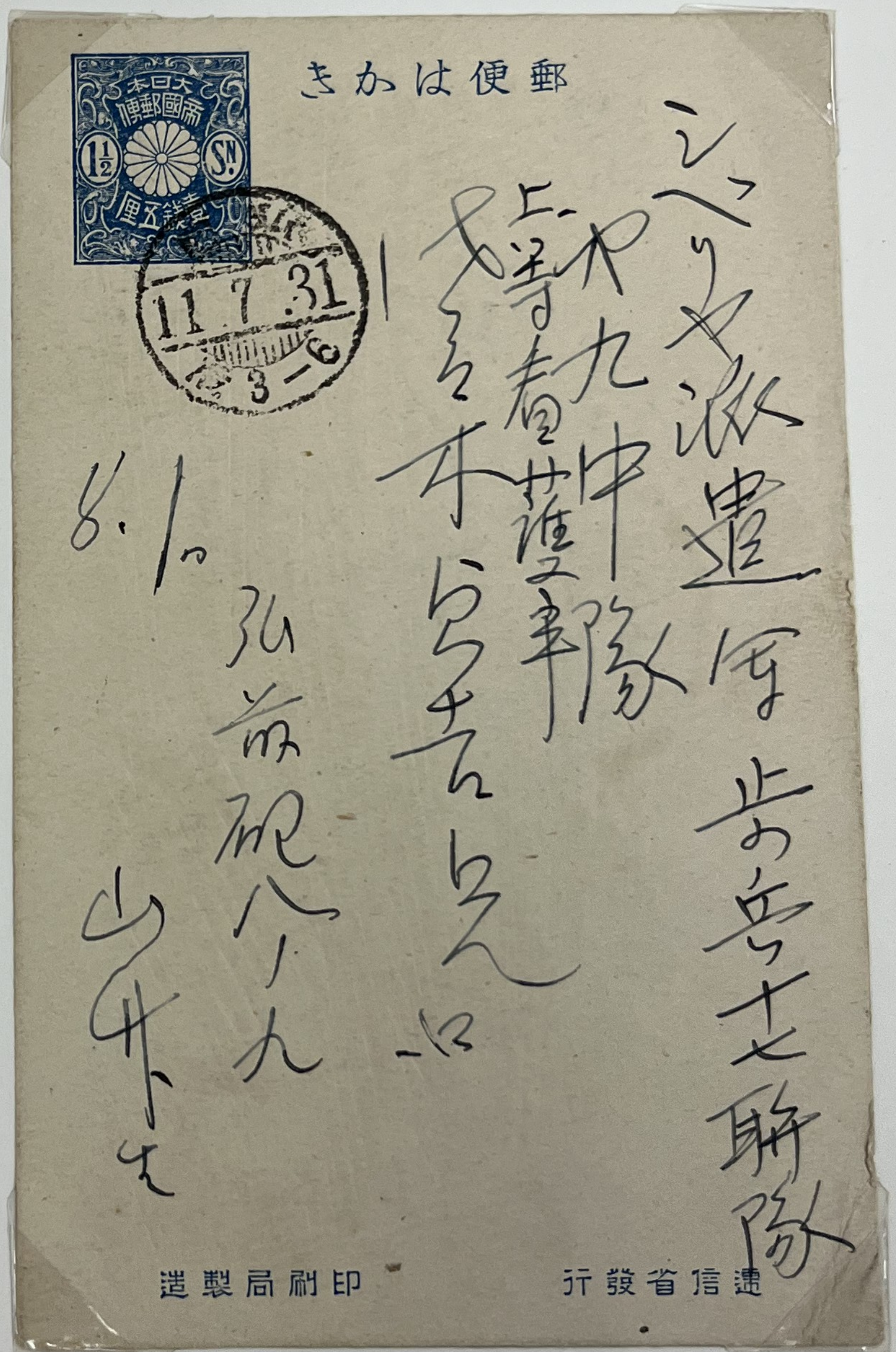
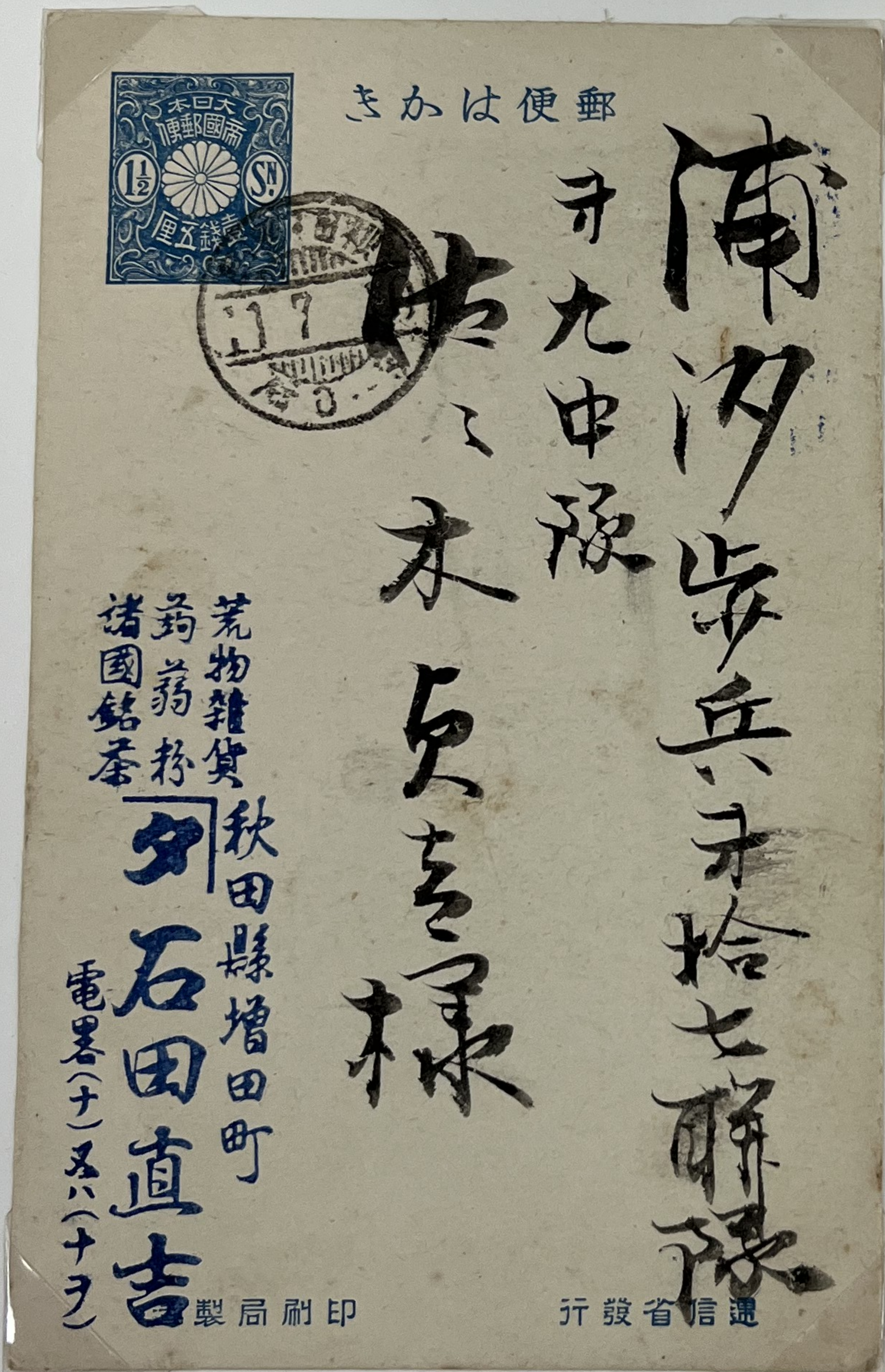


JAPANESE INTERVENTION FORCES – SIBERIA.

JAPANESE INCOMING MAIL AKITA, JAPAN – VLADIVOSTOK, RUSSIA.

Scarce incoming Military Mail to the Japanese Army, this mail was sent from Akita, Japan, to the Japanese Military sorting/distribution Post Office in Vladivostok for delivery to the troops via the Field Post Office system.
The Infantry 17th Regiment, were located at Harbin, Manchuria, during 1921 – 1922.

Dear Mathu and Dad

Received your letter and Xmas cards from Betty and Anna today. Am terribly sorry to hear that you were sick but hope you are all right now. I imagine you are working too hard and wish you wouldn't do it because I don't imagine it is necessary.

My three years and eight months do not start until I arrive in Shanghai and they also must end in Shanghai which means that if I arrive on a certain date I have 3 years & 8 months later, it takes one month to get home, I have 2 months at home, one month to get back and thus four years after I first arrived in Shanghai I am back again. Anyhow I would not want to arrive home until the first of June at the earliest as the summer here is the worst and the summer at home is the best.

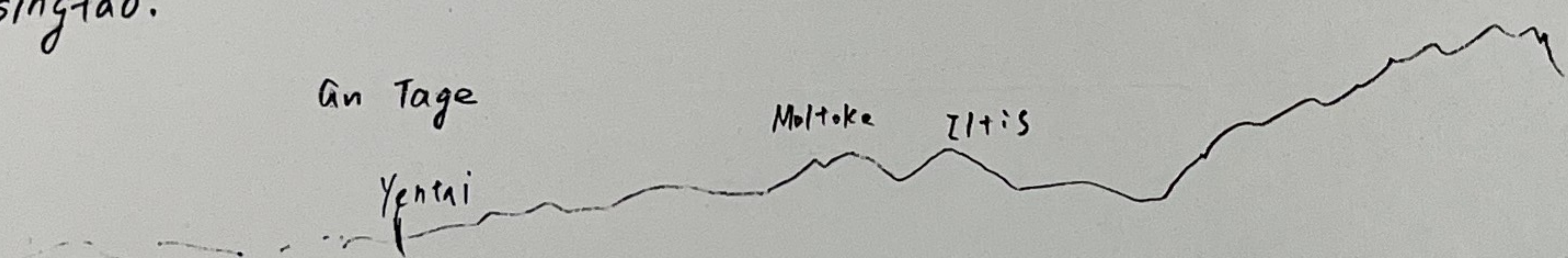
I am rather glad to hear that Alta is going to marry Geo. Clements as he is a nice chap and not inclined to squander etc.

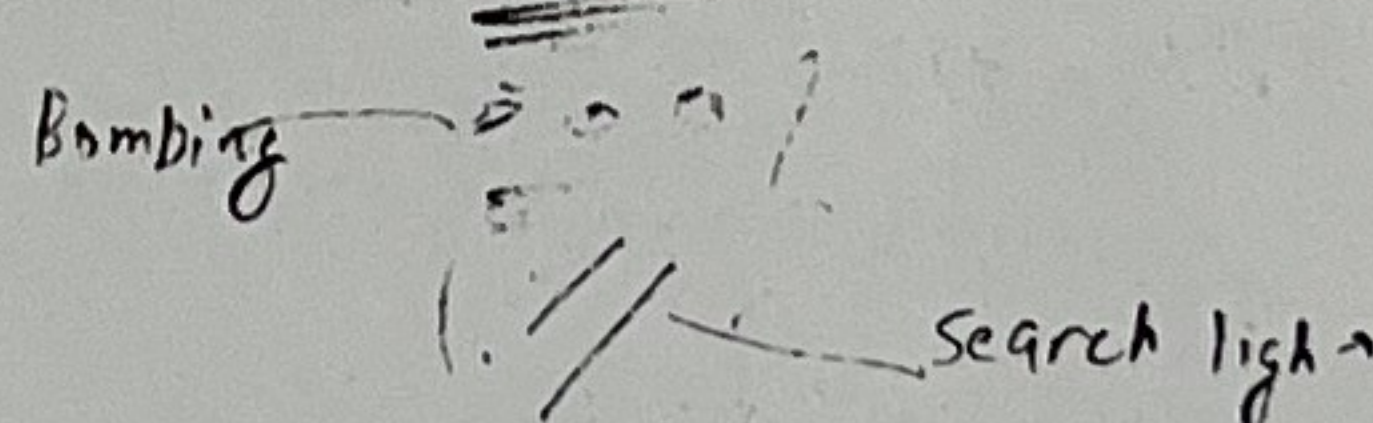

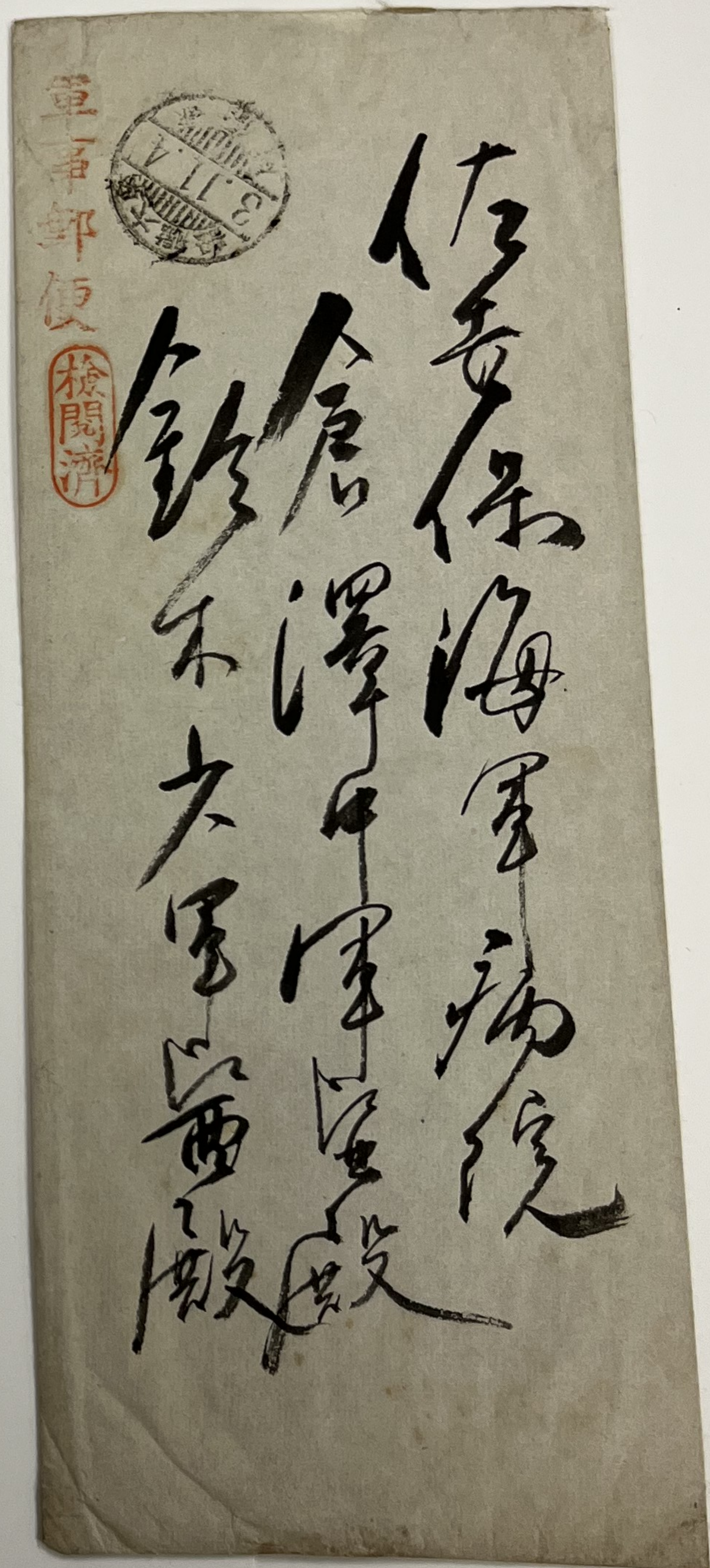

letter, I can't confirm the date of use. It's supposed that 4.11.3 (1914)
was the day of arrival at Sasebo. In October there was a heavy battle
in Shantung Peninsula. Warship P.A.No.6 was supposed to be in the
ship serving on the South Sea. But This letter confirm it's not right

framed 'Censored' mark in red.

JAPANESE FIELD POST RELAY STATION No. 8.

Scarce Military Mail from the Japanese Army at the Field Post Relay Station No. 8 located at Ushumun, Siberia, Russia.
This Field Post Relay Station No. 8 opened at Ushumun on the 17th April 1919 and closed on the 4th January 1920.
The Infantry 33rd Regiment of the 3rd Division is known to be at this location during July 1919.
