Extraordinary item in the finest condition.
Outstanding and exceptional quality.
Choice, first-class condition.
Stamp or cover in sound condition; if a stamp, it is slightly less well-centered than Very Fine but better centered than Fine.
Sound in all respects. Perforated stamps will have the designs clear of the perforations; the designs of imperforate stamps will not be cut in to any significant degree.
Imperfect centering (stamps) or poor general appearance.

Any stamp faults such as a thin spot, tear, crease etc., will be described at all times. Postally used covers should be expected to have the normal degree of wear associated with them and this wear is not grounds for return. The grade of a cover is independent of the grade of the stamps on it. Covers from the famous Carroll-Hoy correspondence will normally have a small unobtrusive staple hole. In lots containing several items, degrees of condition denote the overwhelming average and examples above and below such condition can be expected.

## Terms of Sale

## Bidding

I. All bids (whether by floor bidders, mail bidders, or telephone bidders) will have a premium of $18 \%$ added to the auction sale price.
II. All bids are per lot as numbered in the catalog unless otherwise announced by the auctioneer at the time of sale. The right is reserved to withdraw any lot prior to sale, to divide a lot, or to group two or more lots, or to act on behalf of the seller. Schuyler Rumsey Philatelic Auctions, Inc. will execute bidding instructions on behalf of clients, but will not be responsible for any errors in the execution of such bids. Schuyler Rumsey Philatelic Auctions, Inc. is not liable for bidding errors related to live auction internet bidding and/or the loss of internet connection during the live auction.
III. The highest bidder shall prevail; lots are sold at one increment over the second highest bid. Should any dispute arise between bidders, the decision of the auctioneer as to the successful bidder and the reoffering or resale of the lot under dispute shall rest entirely on the judgment of the auctioneer. The auctioneer shall regulate the bidding and reserve the right to refuse any bid believed by him not to be made in good faith.
IV. Consignor has and retains the right to bid personally, or by his duly appointed agent, through the auctioneer, unless the sale is advertised and announced as one restricting such bidding by consignors or their agents.

## Payments of Purchases

V. FLOOR BIDDERS. Floor bidders shall furnish the auctioneer their names and addresses prior to bidding on any lot. The name and address of the buyer of each lot shall be registered with the auction house following the sale of each lot. Payment of the whole purchase price shall be made by the floor buyer in such manner as the auctioneer may determine. Special credit arrangements must be made prior to the sale.
VI. MAIL BIDDERS. A successful mail bidder will be notified of lots purchased and must remit payment before the lots are sent. Auction bills are due and payable upon receipt of notification. If buyer's payment is not received within ten (10) days, Schuyler Rumsey Philatelic Auctions, Inc. may resell all lots without notice. Any and all losses incurred as a result of resale will be passed on to the defaulting buyer. Cost of postage, registration, etc. will be charged to buyer. Proof by the auctioneer of receipt of sending at the advised address shall constitute delivery.
VII. DIRECT DRAFTS/TRANSFERS. A successful mail bidder known to us may contact our office at (415) 781-5127 for the information necessary to pay directly into the vendor bank account. Any additional charges resulting from processing payments by this method shall be borne by the buyer. Method of payment should be noted on the bid sheet.
VIII. Title shall not pass to the buyer until full payment is received by Schuyler J. Rumsey Philatelic Auctions, Inc.
IX. All of our lots are sold as genuine. Lots accompanied by recent (within 5 years of sale date) expert certificates are sold "as is" based on the description in the certificate. The aforementioned expertized lots may not be returned under any circumstances including those instances in which subsequent certificates yield conflicting opinions. The accepted authorities for U.S. stamps are the Philatelic Foundation (P.F.), the Philatelic Stamp Authentication and Grading, Inc. (P.S.A.G.) and the Professional Stamp Expertizing Committee (P.S.E.). In addition, a lot may not be returned because an expertising service grades a stamp lower than the grade stated in the description, or differs from the accompanying certificate.
X. The Auctioneer must be notified within 5 business days from the date of the auction of any request to place a lot on extension for expertising. All extensions must be paid in full, in advance. There will be no exceptions and no lots may be returned under any circumstances if this term has not been strictly followed.
XI. All lots on extension must be submitted for expertising by the auctioneer exclusively. Each lot is sold as genuine, except those described "as is", but when, in the opinion of a competent authority acceptable to Schuyler J. Rumsey Philatelic Auctions, Inc., the lot is declared otherwise, the purchase price will be refunded in full. The lot must be received by Schuyler J. Rumsey Philatelic Auctions, Inc. within a period of 21 days from the date of auction. Expenses incurred for purposes of expertising shall be borne by the purchaser except where the lot is found by said competent authority to be materially not as described, in which case the consignor will be responsible for expertising costs incurred. Proof of the inability of said competent authority to express a definite opinion is not grounds for return of an item.
XII. Any lot, description of which is incorrect, is returnable (A) within three (3) days of receipt and (B) if received by Schuyler J. Rumsey Philatelic Auctions, Inc. within twenty-one (21) days from the date of the auction. All disputed lots must be returned intact, in the condition received; no adjustments will be made. The following lots are not returnable: lots containing ten (10) or more items; lots from purchasers OR THEIR AGENTS who had the opportunity to examine them before the auction; items described as having defects or of a quality standard "Very Good" (V.G.) or below; lots with disputed centering or margins when the item is photographed; lots described "as is".
XIII. JURISDICTION. In the event of any dispute between the auctioneer and bidders, or between any parties requesting inspection of any of the lots and the auctioneer, or between persons offering their lots to be auctioned and the auctioneer, the jurisdiction over the dispute shall be in the City and County of San Francisco, State of California.

# The Dr. Armando Grassi Collection of Classic United States 



I first met Dr. Armando Grassi more than 25 years ago at the Westpex exhibition. We attended many philatelic gatherings together and as our friendship developed, I quickly realized he had all the attributes of a great philatelist. First and foremost, he had an inquisitive mind and a deep love of history.

As boy growing up in Argentina, Dr Grassi became very interested in science and history. These two interests formed the foundation for his lifelong pursuits - becoming a successful Neonatologist and a dedicated Postal Historian and stamp collector.

After graduating from the Medical School of the University of Buenos Aires, he furthered his training as a Fellow in Neonatology at The New York Hospital - Cornell University Medical College in New York City when the field of Neonatology was in its infancy. Dr. Grassi was one of the early pioneers in caring for premature and high-risk newborns, contributing to the development of techniques that have allowed these babies to survive and to thrive. He has always been fascinated by the transition from fetal life to the outside world. Perhaps one of his greatest contributions was to establish a level 3 Neonatal Intensive Care Unit from scratch, training doctors and health professionals with the same tireless dedication that he applies to all his endeavors.

Throughout his medical career, he has continued to pursue his interest in Philately and Postal History. Dr. Grassi's first important collection comprises United States stamps. On the forthcoming pages, you'll encounter some of the most exquisite Classic United States stamps ever assembled. Not only was the quality important to Dr. Grassi, but so was the overall eye appeal of an item. His pursuit was tireless, seeking out gem-quality stamps embellished with captivating cancellations. Whether it be a simple postmark perfectly struck or a fancy cancellation, he always strove to find the finest possible example.

As with many serious philatelists, Dr. Grassi was drawn to the study of Postal History. He was intrigued how the mails travelled, how routes were affected by economic, social and natural events. The routes and rates have been the subject of several studies over the years; however, Dr. Grassi wanted to dig deeper. He wanted to understand not just how a route changed, but also why, which led to his in depth study of international mail routes. Whether it was an outbreak of cholera in the African continent or frozen waterways in Scandinavia, this research was his new focus. Dr. Grassi approached the development of this new collection with the same passion he had shared in his professional life.

This collection, ExternalMail Routes of the United States: 1854-1875 includes some of the most interesting covers and exotic destinations found in United States Philately. He has given several lectures on the subject and has won numerous awards and medals including gold at the international level in PhilaNippon 2011, Bangkok 2013 and New York 2016.

Given his keen interest in history, Dr. Grassi embarked on his next philatelic endeavor, the Crimean War. Fascinated by the events surrounding this landmark war, he studied and read every history book on the subject. Dr. Grassi then set about forming what is perhaps the finest collection ever assembled. This collection includes virtually every rarity and historic item from this important and poorly understood conflict. This is perhaps his most beloved collection which includes letters and documents by Queen Victoria, Napoleon and Florence Nightingale.

I am honored and proud to offer the first portion of the Dr. Grassi Collection of Classic United States Stamps but more importantly, I am pleased to call Armando my friend.

The rarity of a stamp like this cannot be overstated. The few known examples with original gum are more often than not, lacking the color, the freshness or the Post Office gum as is found on this remarkable stamp.

This is one of two known examples graded Superb 98 Jumbo by the P.S.E. with none higher. Additionally, there are no recorded examples of the $5 \phi$ Red Brown (Scott 1) graded higher than Superb 98, of which there is a single example, which was sold in our sale of the Peter Iwate Collection (Sale 105, Lot 3012).

According to the Jerome S. Wagshal census of the Scott \#5 (this example being 5-CAN-005) there are only 98 examples in all recorded. This example is one of a small handful of examples showing the complete design. Position 7R1E is the only position on any of the $1 \phi$ Imperforate plates to show the true Type I with the complete design as it existed on the original die. This example, with wide sheet margin at top, very light cancellations leaving design almost completely unobscured and a virtually complete design makes this example one of the finest extant.

On August 16, 1861, the first delivery of the new issues were accepted by the stamp agent of the Post Office Department and distribution followed shortly thereafter. It is accepted that the first day of usage was the following day as the Baltimore Post Office ran an advertisement that day stating they were prepared at that time to exchange old envelopes and stamps for the new issues. This $1 \phi$ stamp and a $3 \phi$ stamp on cover used from Baltimore Post Office on August 17, 1861 indicates that this was one of the first offices to receive and distribute the new 1861 issues.
